What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Simplicity KiwiSaver Balanced Fund (Balanced Fund) has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Simplicity NZ Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

The Balanced Fund provides investors with exposure to a mix of growth and income assets. As a result, the return from the Fund is likely to be lower over the longer term (10 years or more) than the Growth Fund, but the value of its investments is likely to fluctuate more than the Conservative Fund.

Risk indicator

How has the fund performed?

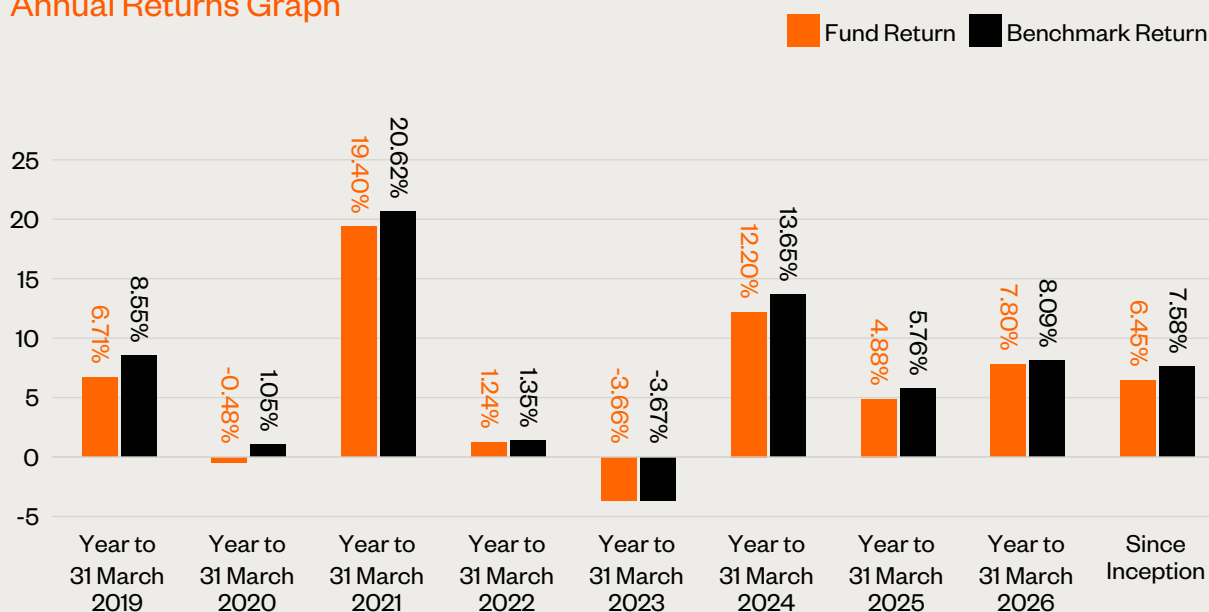

Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

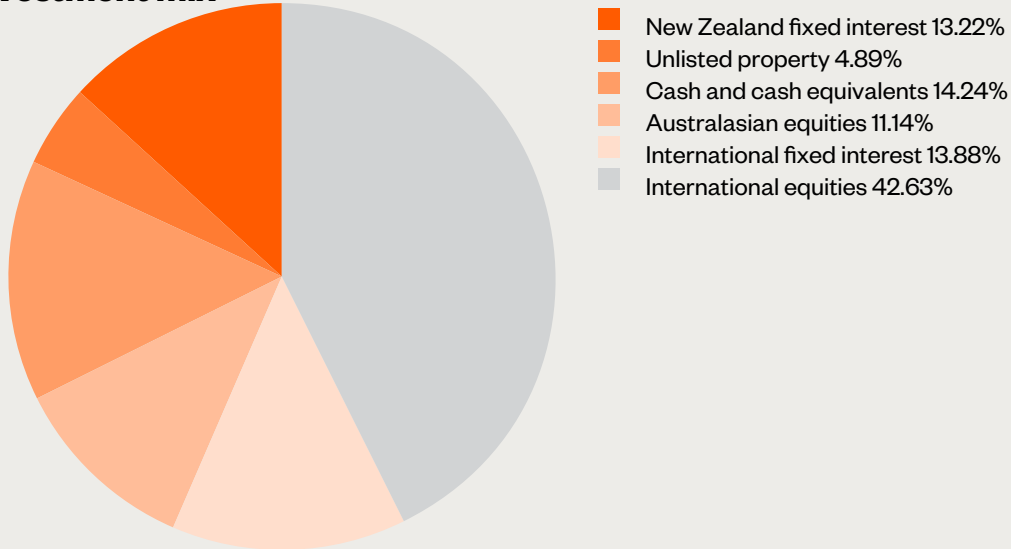
Artie had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Artie received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$1,336 (that is 13.36% of their initial \$10,000). This gives Artie a total return after tax of \$1,222 for the period.

The top ten investments make up 22.42% of the fund. The fund's exposure to assets denominated in foreign currencies was 58%, of which 62% was hedged. This means the fund's unhedged foreign currency exposure was 22% of the net asset value of the fund.²

Notes

1. Our target equities exposures are 9.25% to New Zealand equities and 43.5% to International equities (which includes approximately 1.5% Australian equities). We have no target for listed property. Exposures to real estate investment trusts are included in equities.
2. Our hedging policy is set using the market average hedging ratio of providers that make up at least 80% of KiwiSaver industry funds under management, resulting in our international fixed interest and equity investments being 100% and 50% hedged into New Zealand dollars respectively. The hedging policy for equities is reviewed six monthly and adjusted from time to time to follow the market reference within a range of 40% - 60%. Hedging instruments are not listed in the top 10 investments.
